




When I first arrived at Strawbridge UMC in July of 2013, I could sense something special about the congregation. Furthermore, the generosity that helped us did an additional \$500,000 to our savings 15-passenger buses, make capital improvements, and add an additional \$500,000 to our savings continues to be stronger than ever.

Fast forward to September 2022. The week after our church voted on a position of full inclusion to love, serve, and welcome all of God's children, hundreds of United Methodists in other congregations in our immediate and surrounding area suddenly found themselves in search of a new church home. 



- Replace risers in The Choir Room for safety purposes
- Move modesty rail to add a fourth row to The Chancel
- Update hallways on first and second floor
- Update bathrooms: Narthex, Sanctuary, and lobby areas
- Create a sensory room for special needs individuals




